Card users will receive a 50% discount on fees at Corps-operated day use areas and campgrounds. For more details

Card holders who also present a copy of their mid- or post-deployment (reintegration) leave orders from Overseas Contingency Operations may receive free camping for themselves and their dependents. Camping waiver only applies on a walk up or space available basis. Not available to Civilians or Veterans.</p> <p>For more details</p>

	America the Beautiful Interagency Every Kid in a Park 4 th Grade Pass	Yes	Yes	FREE	<p>The <i>Every Kid in a Park</i> 4th Grade Pass is free for U.S. 4th grade students and covers entrance and standard amenity fees. The pass is obtained by the student exchanging an <i>Every Kid in a Park</i> pass voucher for the pass. This pass is valid for 12 months beginning September of the year that the student begins 4th grade. Note: All passes are valid September through August of the year that the student is in the 4th grade.</p> <p>For more details</p>
	America the Beautiful Volunteer Pass	No	No	FREE with 250 volunteer hours	<p>Issued to volunteers who accrue 250 volunteer hours provided they do not already have a valid Interagency Pass. Valid for one year from month of issuance. Volunteers may count any hours accrued beginning January 1, 2007. Once the 250 hours is reach and pass issued, the volunteer's hours are reset to zero and the county begins again. Only one Interagency Volunteer Pass may be issued per 12-month period.</p> <p>For more details</p>
