

SUBJECT: Formerly Used Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) 96X3130

1. The Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act, 1998 appropriated money for FUSRAP and transferred the program from the Department of the Energy to the Corps for program execution. The Corps has been directed to review the baseline cost, scope, schedule and technical assumptions for each of the cleanup sites, and determine what actions can be taken to reduce costs and accelerate cleanup activities.
2. A new appropriation, 96X3130, will be used to account for FUSRAP projects. The enclosed listing provides the valid Category Class Sub-class codes that will be utilized to identify the type of work.
3. Most districts will get funds directly allotted through the Program Budget Accounting System (PBAS). Those districts that do not receive direct funds may receive funding by Military Departmental Purchase Request (MIPR). When funding is received from another district via a MIPR (brokered work), the order should be accepted into the Construction General (96X3122) appropriation, with Category Class Sub-class 999 used to record the order. Districts that receive direct FUSRAP funding and receive brokered FUSRAP work from another district with direct funding will accept the order into the FUSRAP appropriation (96X3130) and will use the reimbursable Category Class Sub-class codes for the particular category of work as identified on the enclosure.
